Discussion	<p>Parishioner Kevin Scrase now had 9 volunteers and would organise training for the new recruits. There were 4 authorised sites giving 8 possible directions for Speedwatch to monitor and he was seeking permission for further sites in the village. He confirmed that any personal and specific data collected by Speedwatch could not be shared with other village groups. A car near Prima had actually damaged the speed indicator device.</p>		
	<p>Cllr Tee had written to the Aylesham Development Fund to try to obtain Section 106 funding for speed reduction initiatives. He had received an acknowledgment but nothing else so far. He had also drafted a letter to the Police Commissioner and a Highways Improvement Plan but would deliver these after his attendance at a Seminar for Highways and Development being run by KCC. This was due on 14th November.</p>		
	<p>The recently reported overgrown hedge in Easole St had not been cut back. A traffic sign was obscured by the hedge and Cllr Manion was tasked with trying to get progress on the hedge cutting.</p>
